






# Who took part?

#### 2. Town Profile

Carrigatine is in an area of local natural beauty whose scenic walking and cycling routes overtook Castle ruins, Holy Welfs and Ring Forts. It is just nine klometres from Cork Airport, five and a half kilometres from the Carr Ferry and Port at Ringaskiddy, and buses run from there to Cork City and Airport, Ringaskiddy, Crosshaven and Ballincollig.



The lootpath along the north bank of the Ovenabue leads from the centric to the Town Pank, with its riverside walks, outdoor gym circuit, playground and soutphare by the river, represents just one of the many local widthe species I river.
